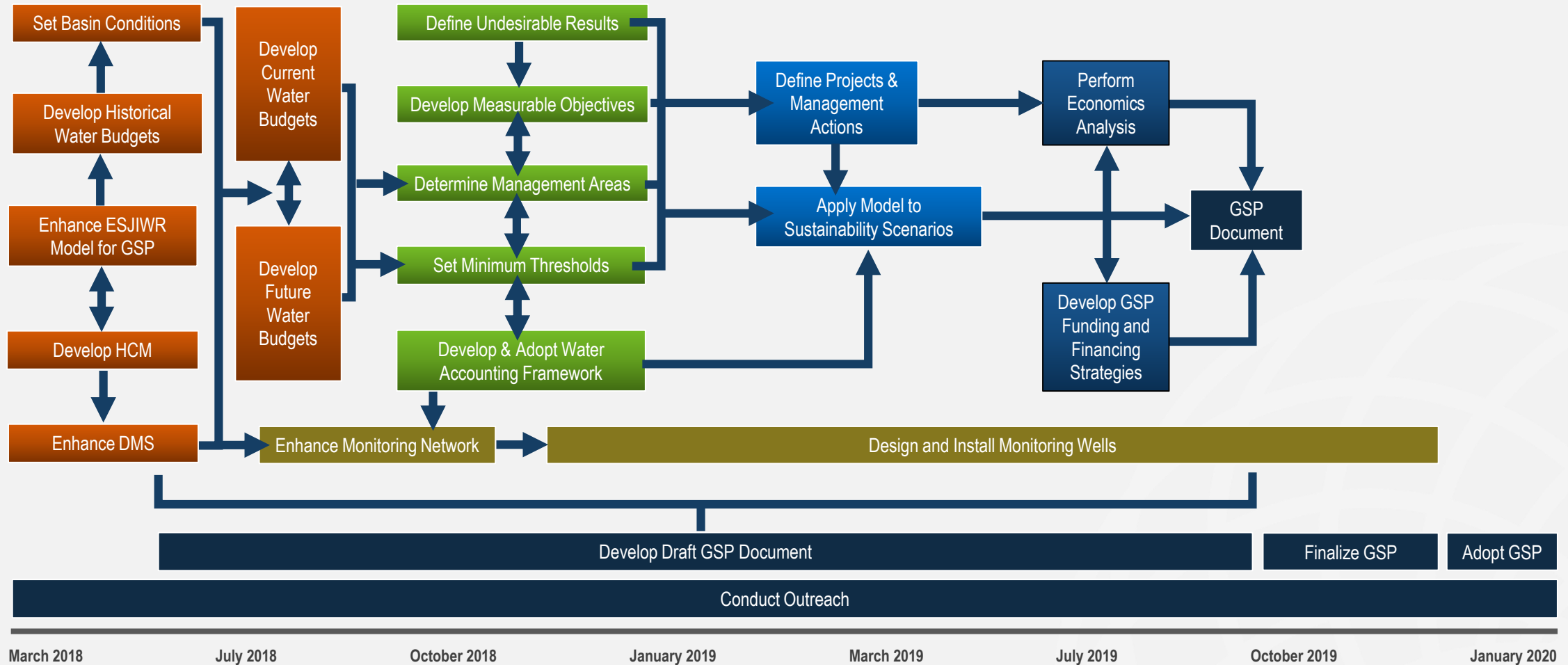

Making Best Use of Available Time will be Critical



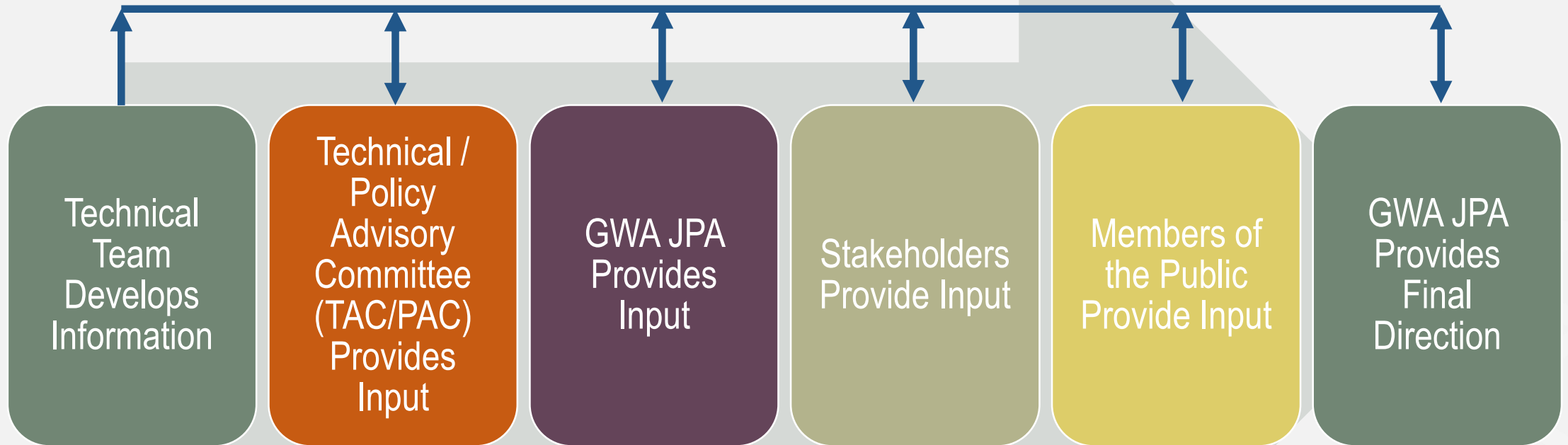
One of Our First Tasks will be to Engage the Multiple Types and Levels of “Stakeholders” to the Process

Developing clear messages, guidelines, and objectives for each level of participation will ultimately make the process productive

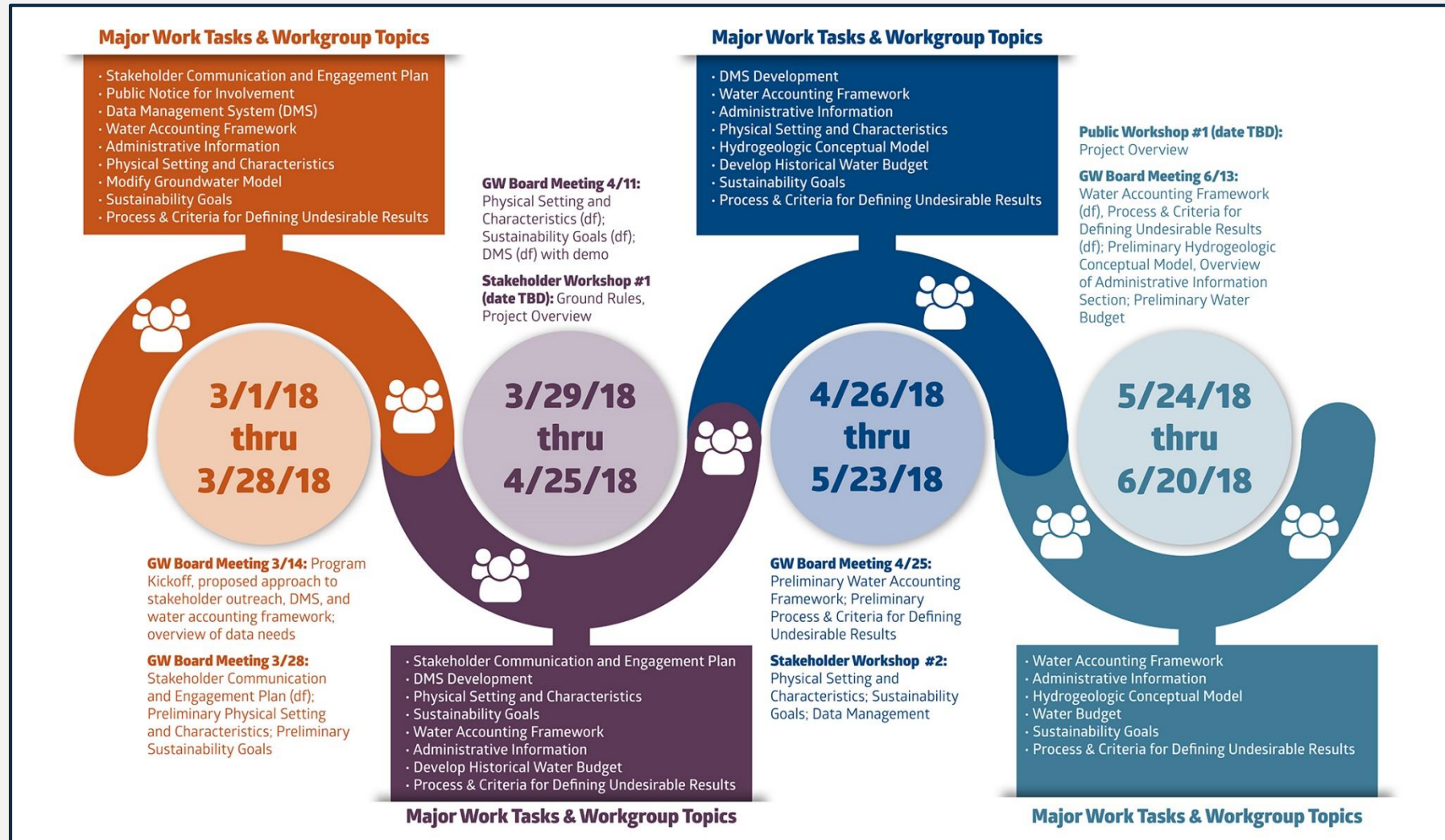
Information Flow will Provide Opportunities for Broad Input While Preserving GWA JPA Authority

- Full GWA JPA will provide input at monthly Board meetings

Immediate-Term Actions

Assemble TAC / PAC to meet monthly

Meet with each GSA to understand issues and concerns

Update webpage and public information portal

Prepare and implement stakeholder outreach and engagement plan

Revise and distribute project roadmap

Begin work on GSP development:

- Data Management System (DMS)
- Water Accounting Framework
- Administrative Information
- Physical Setting and Characteristics
- Sustainability Goals
